



Scholarship Guidelines

- The scholarship awards of the Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation (LGCF) will be offered to exceptional music students interested in Latin music, preferably between the ages of 17 and 24 and with financial limitations that prevent them from studying at a prestigious music institution.
- Students applying for the **Carlos Vives Scholarship presented by the Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation**, for the **Gifted Tuition Scholarship**, or for the **Tuition Assistance Scholarship** have to be previously admitted at a music institution of degree college level, approved by the LGCF. All interested students must complete the application process by the deadline of **April 10th, 2018 at 11:59pm ET**. Applications that are late, incomplete, or not within the guidelines will not be reviewed.
- The scholarship selection and award process will be guided by a Scholarship Committee formed by Latin music experts elected by the LGCF.
- Each applicant must submit online links in YouTube of two (2) video recording auditions of the applicant, playing two (2) pieces of Latin music genres with an accompanist or small ensemble. The first piece performed should be in a medium tempo and the second piece in a fast tempo. If you can, improvise a minimum of two choruses. Improvisation is not a requisite, but it is welcomed. The two required pieces should not last more than 15 minutes. Original compositions can be included as a third optional piece. All applicants must clearly identify themselves in all recordings so that the Scholarship Committee can fairly identify the applicant and evaluate each performance.
- Each applicant must submit two (2) letters of recommendation from the applicant's music teachers or music instructors describing the applicant's academic and musical performance levels.
- All applicants must be admitted to the music institution at college degree level, approved by the LGCF, where they wish to study in, and must upload their admittance letter to the LGCF Scholarship Application.
- Payments of Scholarship Awards will be made by the Foundation directly to the music institution on behalf of the scholarship recipient, and will be made on a semester basis. Awarded students must send to the LGCF their official student invoices and payment calendars of their music institutions upon receiving notification of the scholarship.
- If the applicants have been also awarded scholarships by their music institution or other organizations, they must upload their awarded scholarship letters to the LGCF application.
- Please note that all applicants who receive awards from LGCF must comply with our *Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract* below.
- The LGCF reserves the right to ask the applicant for additional information.
- The LGCF does not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, religion, national origin, disability, or age.

- All LGCF scholarships must be used within a maximum of 6 months of being awarded (start on Fall 2018 or no later than Spring 2019).

Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract

1. The scholarship awarded amount will be paid to the music education institution, on a semester basis, on behalf of the awarded student.
2. The awarded students will become Goodwill Promoters of the LGCF and will be joining in promoting its mission, service to communities, and furthering its good works.
3. The scholarship recipients may be invited by the LGCF to participate in performances involving other scholarship recipients. They may also be invited to participate in special events and press conferences intended to publicize the scholarship program of the LGCF and the achievements of the recipients.
4. All awarded students must send to the LGCF their grades at the end of each semester of study. We also require at the end of each semester a letter of recommendation from the students' private instructor or ensemble professor and a description of the activities in which the student was involved in at the music institution and/or with the LGCF. All of this information must be submitted at the end of each semester. If all of these requirements are met the student may continue to receive his or her scholarship for the following semesters.
5. Students awarded the Carlos Vives Scholarship or the Gifted Tuition Scholarships must be enrolled in full-time study with a minimum of 12 credits each semester.
6. The students awarded the Carlos Vives Scholarship and Gifted Tuition Scholarship must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50 per semester. Students awarded the Tuition Assistance Scholarship must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 per semester.
7. Recipients must **NOT** be in academic or disciplinary probation or receive D or F grades at any time with the music institution that the scholarship was granted.
8. The scholarship awarded will be used in the principal instrument that the student auditioned for, unless a change of principal instrument is recommended by his or her private instruction professor, the Department Dean or Director, and is approved by the LGCF.
9. Recipients must enroll in an institutional group or ensemble that incorporates Latin music each year of his/her studies.
10. If a recipient is given an award other than one by the Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation Scholarship, he/she must inform the LGCF of that award in writing.
11. Upon notification of the scholarship, all awarded students will receive via email a W-8BEN tax form if they reside outside the United States, or a W-9 tax form if they reside in the United States. All completed tax documents must be returned via email to the LGCF. If the LGCF does not receive the tax document from the student, the scholarship will be rescinded.
12. All awarded students must send the LGCF an official tuition invoice from the music institution, an official payment calendar with the payment due dates, and a W-8BEN E tax form if the music institution is outside the United States or a W-9 tax form if the music institution is in the United States.
13. All LGCF scholarships must be used within a maximum of 6 months of being awarded (start on Fall 2018 or no later than Spring 2019).

14. All LGCF scholarships are NOT transferable and must be used at the music institution or university to which it was awarded to.

By signing this *Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract* the student accepts the scholarship awarded by the Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation and agrees to all the terms and conditions in this document.

The **Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation Fund** offers three tiers of scholarship awards to gifted individuals, with interest in Latin music and that require financial assistance. **All students can apply to all three (3) awards, but will only be awarded one (1) of the three (3) scholarships.** In 2018, the LGCF applicants can be awarded **one (1)** of the following scholarships:

Tier 1. Carlos Vives Scholarship presented by the Latin GRAMMY Cultural Foundation:

- In 2018 the Carlos Vives Scholarship will be awarded to **one (1)** exceptional student interested in Latin music, that has **severe financial limitations** and has been **previously admitted to Berklee College of Music** in Boston to start in the **2018 Fall semester**.
- Berklee will receive an award on behalf of the student **for up to US \$50,000 annually**, for four years of **full time study** towards a Bachelor Degree, and for a total amount of up to **US \$200,000**.
- In order to qualify for continued assistance, the student must honor and maintain standards of excellence that will be assessed **every semester** of the four years of study.
- The selected student must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of **3.50 each semester**.
- Awarded students must comply with the *Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract* of the Foundation.
- All applicants must complete the Carlos Vives Scholarship application on the LGCF website, before the **April 10th, 2018** deadline.

Tier 2. Gifted Tuition Scholarship 2018

- The 2018 Gifted Tuition Scholarships will support **three (3)** talented music students interested in Latin music and requiring financial assistance, to continue their musical education at college degree level.
- Those who demonstrate the most talent, perseverance and determination will be selected, by the Scholarship Committee, from a competitive pool of international applicants.
- The award will cover four years of **full time study** towards a Bachelor Degree in the music institution at college level that the recipient was admitted in.
- Each scholarship recipient will receive an award **for up to US \$25,000 annually**, for four years of **full time study** towards a Bachelor Degree and for a **total amount of up to US \$100,000**.
- In order to qualify for continued assistance, each recipient must honor and maintain standards of excellence that will be assessed **every semester** of the four years of study.

- The students selected to receive the Gifted Tuition Scholarship must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of **3.50 each semester of study**.
- Awarded students must comply with the *Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract* of the Foundation in order to continue to receive the award for each semester.
- All applicants must complete Gifted Scholarship Application on the LGCF website before the **April 10th, 2018** deadline.

Tier 3. Tuition Assistance Scholarship 2018

- The Tuition Assistance Scholarships will be awarded to aspiring talented music students, with interest in Latin music and with financial limitations. The recipients will be selected by the Scholarship Committee from an international pool of candidates.
- In 2018, the Tuition Assistance Awards will support up to **forty (40)** students.
- The music institution approved by the LGCF in which the student is enrolled will receive **up to US \$10,000** towards his/her music training and college education for one year. The scholarship can be divided between the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 semesters.
- If the awarded scholarship is divided into one or two semesters, all scholarship-recipients must honor and maintain standards of excellence that will be assessed **every semester** and maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of **3.00 each semester of study**.
- All applicants must complete the Tuition Assistance Award Application on the LGCF website before the **April 10th, 2018** deadline.
- Awarded students must comply with the *Student Scholarship Terms and Conditions Contract* of the Foundation.
- All applicants must complete the Tuition Assistance Scholarships Application on the LGCF website before the **April 10th, 2018** deadline

The deadline to apply for the Carlos Vives Scholarship, the Gifted Tuition Scholarships, or the Tuition Assistance Scholarships is April 10th, 2018.
